DRESS CODE

Merrylands RSL Club is dedicated to providing its Members and guests with a high standard of facilities and services. The Club adheres to a Clean, Neat and Tidy dress code taking into consideration current fashions and expects all patrons to dress in an appropriate manner at all times while on Club premises. The Club reserves the right to refuse entry to any patron considered to not meet the required standards.

As a guideline the following examples of unacceptable dress are to be considered before entering MRSL, but are not limited to:

Unacceptable

- Singlets worn by men (tank tops can be worn)
- Torn clothing
- Dirty work wear
- Offensive apparel bearing culturally or sexually offensive slogans or pictures
- Body odour or unclean/soiled persons
- Bare feet
- Headwear such as caps, bandanas and beanies unless for obvious medical reason or religious headwear* or worn for special events such as Melbourne Cup.

* For the purposes of determining religious headwear - religious headwear must be of a traditional form or widely accepted as religious headwear. For example the mantilla, head veil, head scarf, Turban.
