ANZAC DAY DAWN SERVICE 2023

On a mild Anzac Day morning Merrylands RSL Club in conjunction with MRSL sub-Branch conducted 2023 Anzac Day Dawn Service at Charles Mance Reserve. The morning commenced with early morning activity setting up chairs, marquee, large screens, official stage and cenotaph in readiness for the Dawn service.

At 0515, under the Parade Commander of CUO Edward Bennett veterans, official guests and members of the public were called to form up for the parade. Prior to march off, laying of a wreath was conducted by both David Czerkies (President sub-Branch) and Ron Hand (President of MRSL) in recognition of all service personnel. Under the command of the Parade Commander the march proceeded with the Holroyd Band and the Army Cadets from 204 Cadet Unit leading.

A short march around Merrylands CBD that also included a stop outside Cumberland Council Chambers where a wreath laying was conducted by the two Presidents at the memorial outside council chambers. Then marched to Charles Mance Reserve for the Dawn service.

In recognition of the 55th Anniversary of the Vietnam War, this years Dawn Service paid tribute to those who served during this conflict.

The service attracted a large number of community participants, patrons and veterans. In attendance were also invited guests from State Parliament, Council, local schools and guest speaker for the service Colonel Jodie Lording CSM—Headquarters 8 Brigade.

With the end of Covid restrictions Merrylands Dawn service has commenced with a large crowd attending the Dawn service.

This year the service was in respect to the veterans and turning point of the 55th Anniversary of Vietnam War.

The service format comprised of the Hymns, chaplain's prayers laying of wreaths and speeches. Cerdon College School Captains delivered the Dawn Service Reflection. What a delivery? They were amazing with the speech detailing family connection to service during WW II. Adding a personal tribute in honor of their family member. Guest speaker Colonel Jodie Lording delivered a speech reflecting the service of the past but also added the service of those who are serving today. Portraying the changing world of military service.

The Dawn Service concluded with the Ode being read, the playing of the Last Post, Reveille and the National anthem of both New Zealand and Australian, after which the Cadets dismounted the cenotaph.

Ron Hand concluded the Dawn Service by thanking all in attendance and extended invitation to all members of the public, veterans and guests to breakfast in the RSL.

This being our first year without Covid restrictions the number of community members who attended the service was very welcoming. It anticipated the crowd numbers at this year's service may have been between 2–3000 people.

Next year's Dawn service may even be bigger.
